Summit County Residential Permits

Residential

When do you need a permit? A building permit is required whenever a change to the structural integrity of a building is proposed, and/or finishing an area or room that was previously unfinished. Permits (Electric, HVAC and Plumbing) are required whenever an addition or expansion to an existing mechanical system(s) is proposed.

When do you need a permit? When don't you need a permit?:

Enlarging a window opening / or installing a new patio door- Permit required

Roof tear-off and complete shingle replacement- Permit required

Building, enlarging or replacing a deck (structural members)- Permit required

Installing new or replacing exterior siding-Permit Required

Replacing a hot water tank, furnace or A/C unit (safety device)- Permit required

Replacing fixtures that require system alterations- Permit required

Adding supply or return air ducts- Permit required

Adding an exhaust fan in an existing bathroom- Permit required

Building or placing a single-story accessory structure (storage shed) 200 Sq. Ft or less-

No permit required / over 200 Sq. Ft.- Permit required

Replacing of existing fixtures (faucets, sinks, toilets, receptacles, switches, light fixtures)

without altering existing systems- No Permit required

Same size window or door replacement(s)- No permit required

Replacing existing deck flooring material- No permit required

Adding insulation in walls or attic spaces- No permit required

Adding a 2nd layer of shingles to an existing roof- No permit required

Boarding-up a vacant home or building- No permit required

Fences 6' or less / retaining walls up to 4' in height- No permit required

New or replacement driveway / sidewalk- No permit required

Painting, papering, tiling, carpeting, cabinets, countertops and similar finish work- No permit required

NOTE: Exterior additions or alterations to a building, structure or property require local zoning department review and approval (refer to #3, 9, 15, 16 & 17).
