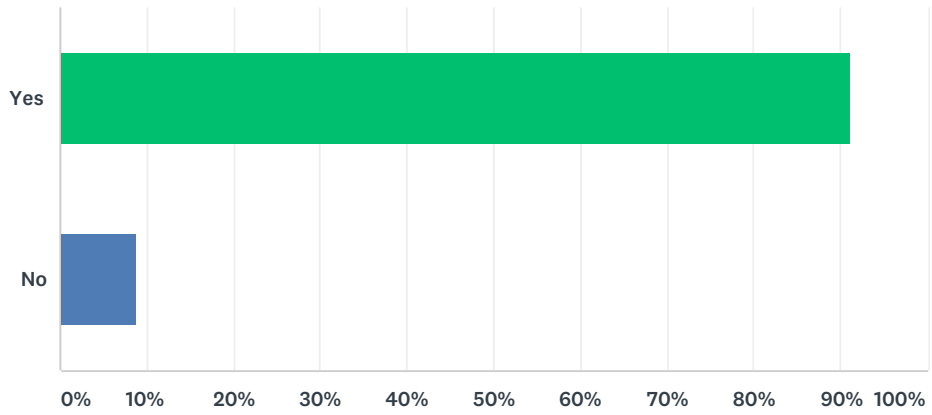


Q1 Are you currently a resident of Northfield Center Township?

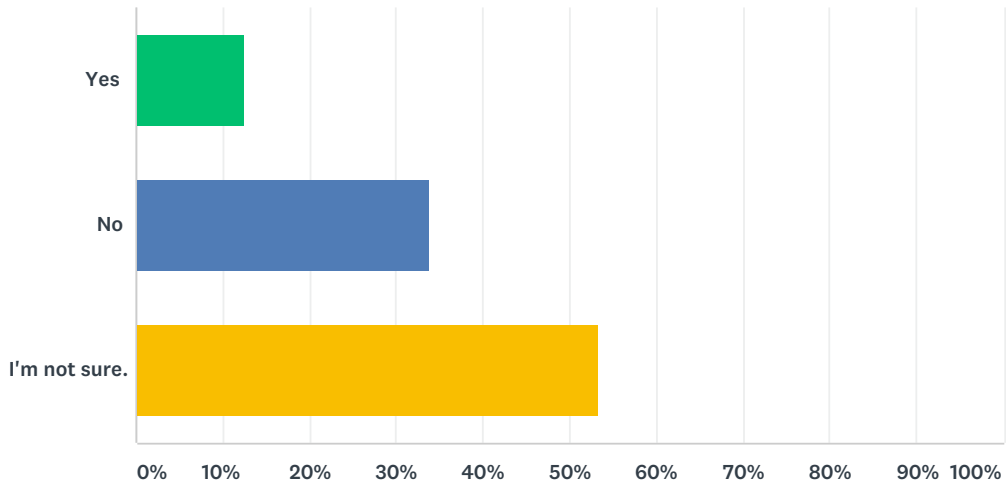

Q2 Are you planning on attending the Public Forum, on May 23rd?

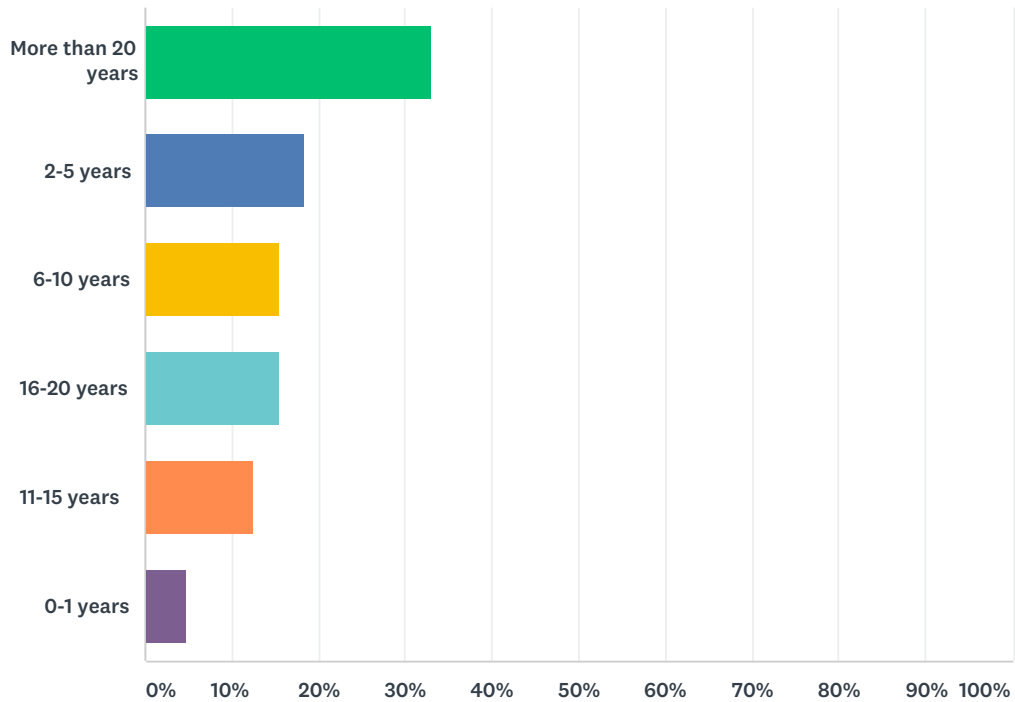

Q3 How long have you been a resident of Northfield Center Township? (If you have lived in the Township on separate occasions, please total the years of residency.)

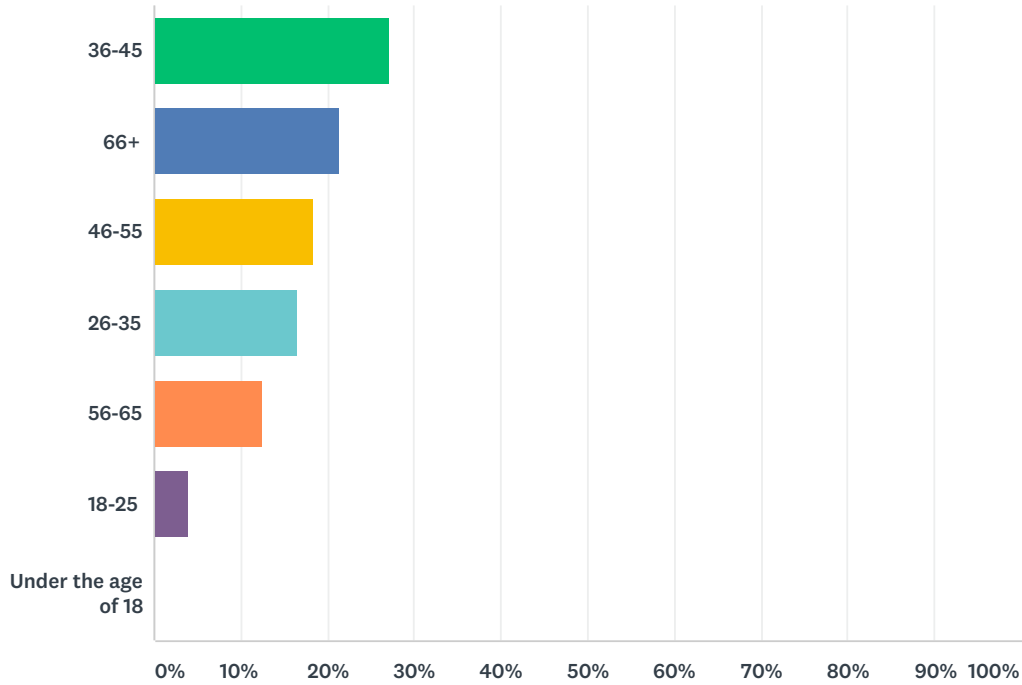

Q4 What is your age range?

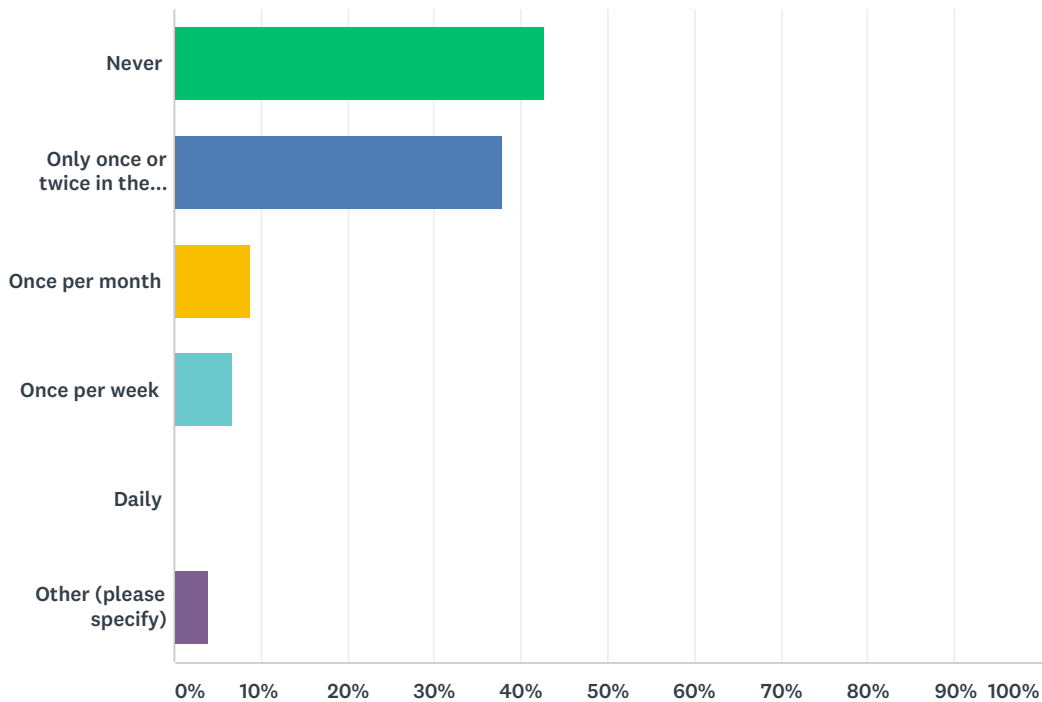

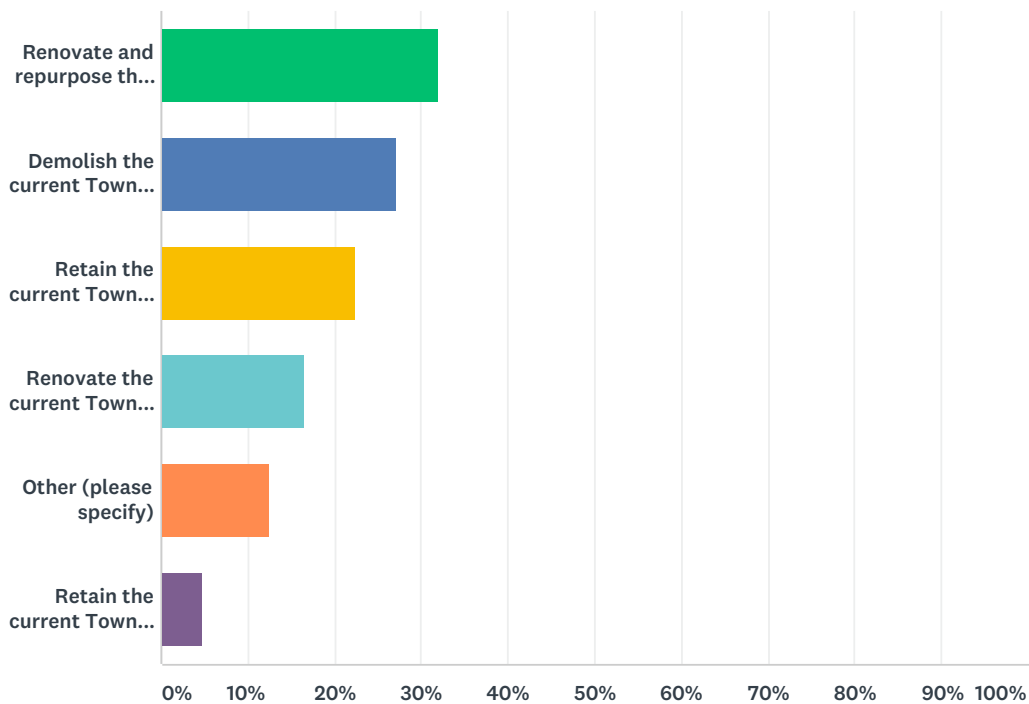

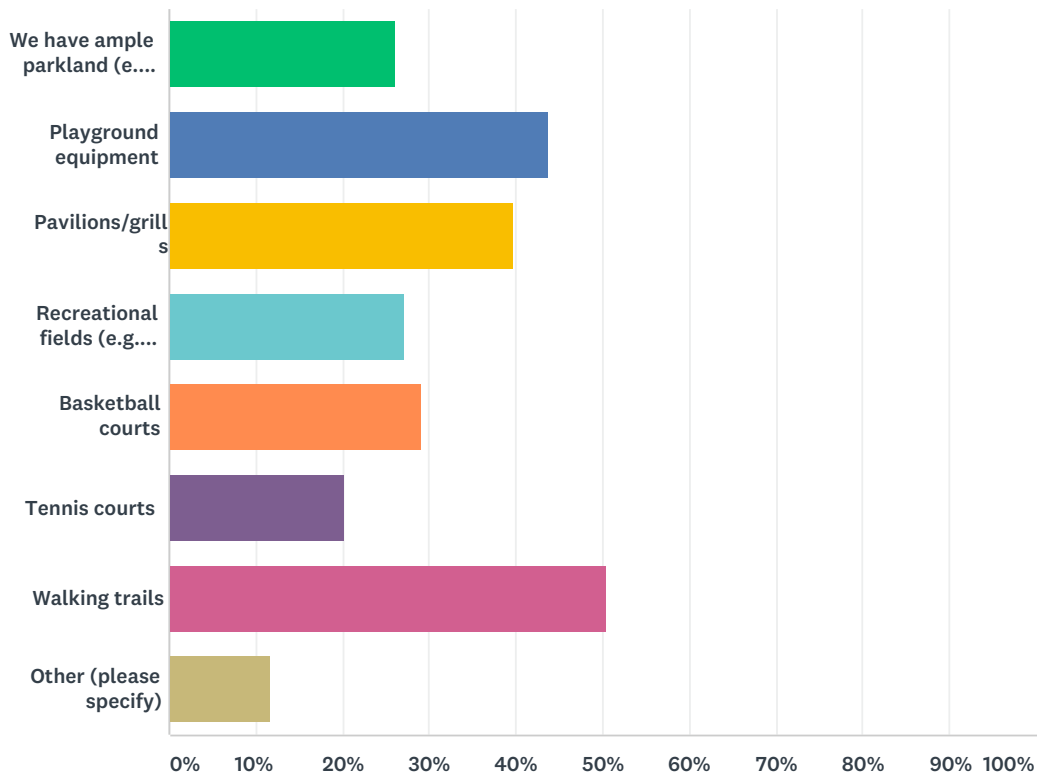
